Classroom Christmas Parties and Gift Exchanges

The teachers have been discussing how to go about having a classroom Christmas party and what to do about Christmas gifts for this school year. After some good discussion and weighing the options, here is what we decided to do:

+ Christmas Party Snacks - Instead of asking you to buy or bring something food-related this year, we're asking that, if you're willing, to donate a few dollars to your child's classroom. Then the teachers will go shopping and purchase food for the classroom Christmas parties. We ask that if you're going to donate a couple dollars for this, you get the money to the teachers by the end of next week (December 18). + Christmas Gifts - We have been in contact with the Hope Center here in Appleton, a branch of WELS United and located on the campus of St. Matthew's Lutheran Church. This year, in place of a student-tostudent gift exchange, we are asking the children to consider donating a gift (or gifts) to the Hope Center. Prior to COVID, the Hope Center typically had 30-40 families per month who were in need that came to them. In November 2020 alone, they had 120 families come to them in need of some help!

This Christmas, please consider sharing the blessings you have with other families in the Fox Valley who don't have as much as you do. The biggest needs the families have right now are daily necessities such as body wash, shampoo/conditioner, toothpaste, toilet paper, hand soap, liquid dish detergent, bleach wipes, diapers, and baby wipes. Additionally, reading books or crafts for children would be appreciated. All items should be new and in store packaging. They also ask that nothing be gift wrapped. We are asking that your child(ren) bring any gifts to school by December 18 to give the Hope Center sufficient time to make them ready for their families. Thank you for considering this Christmas giving opportunity through SVLS to the Hope Center!

SVLS COVID-19 Update


As you are likely aware by now, we have had to quarantine a substantial subset of our school students and are going virtual with two of our classrooms. This is not because families have thrown caution to the wind and stopped taking their precautions. No, it simply means that even though we are taking precautions in school and you are taking precautions out of school, COVID still happens because of the community spread. And with that community spread, it makes tracing the origin of each specific infection extremely difficult, if not impossible. That's not to say we will stop taking the precautions we've been taking; rather, it's crucial that we continue taking the precautions we've been taking! And we continue to be extremely thankful for what you are doing with your families and for your proactive communication with us! Thanks in large part to the precautions you've been taking, we've been able to conduct in-person learning for the vast majority of this school year! In fact, our whole-school overall average rate for in-person learning versus fully virtual learning is 95%! Thank you for doing what you're doing, so we all can continue doing what we're doing at school!

You may also be aware that there is revised guidance from the CDC regarding quarantine durations and such. We are currently actively working with the Calumet County Health Department and with other local and regional school leaders to discuss the details and logistics of the revised guidance and its potential effects. Expect further communication on this topic sometime this week, especially if your child is currently in quarantine.

We continue to appreciate the abundance of caution we have seen our SVLS families take with keeping their children at home if they're sick, and we appreciate your patience as we work together to keep things as consistent as we can during the pandemic. May God continue to give us all a rich measure of patience!

It certainly can be difficult though! Should I keep my child home or send them to school? Should I get tested for COVID-19? Should I take my child to get tested for COVID-19? In most cases, if your child has symptoms consistent with COVID-19, the recommendation of the health department is to get them tested, if only to rule it out. The chart below summarizes when to get tested for COVID-19, according to WI-DHS guidance:

People with the below symptoms or combination of symptoms may have COVID-19. The table below outlines WI-DHS recommendations of who should receive COVID-19 testing in Wisconsin. If you have these symptoms, **stay home, call your school office and get tested.**



For all other illnesses, follow typical school illness protocol by staying home, calling the school office and once your child is 24 hour symptom free they may return. For

For determining whether to keep your child at home or send them to school, please keep your child at home if:

- They are sick
- They are being tested for COVID-19 and are awaiting test results
- They test positive for COVID-19
- They are a close contact of someone with COVID-19
- A family member experiencing COVID-like symptoms is being tested for COVID-19
